

orn in Southeast Missouri in the early 1950's, he joined Warren, Valla Jo, and Gwenn as the 2nd sibling. Brother Brad arrived 2 years later and completed this family. Finishing elementary school and the 7th grade at Doniphan R-1, the family moved to the big city (approx. 17,000 population) of Poplar Bluff, Missouri. Graduating in 1971, he began Jr. College at Crowley's Ridge in Paragould, Arkansas that summer and completed an A. A. degree in 1972.

With no clear path for life's next step, Greg moved to Illinois, Tennessee, Mississippi and back to Missouri over the next three years. He worked at a myriad of labor positions including sales, construction, cooking, factory assembly among several other positions. Maturing and seeing the world in a different manner, he decided to return to College and finished a B.S. in Criminal Justice and a minor in Psychology at Southeast Missouri State University.


During his time at SEMO, he began working with abused neglected youth first at the County Juvenile office and soon for the Mo. Division of youth Services. This is where he found his niche in life. First supervising the youth in the change process, later running a "Group Home" and eventually spending many years Training and developing employees in many skills. In 1994 he returned to College part time and completed an M.A. in Community Counseling.

After retirement from DYS, he continued offering private or contract training for several private and public organizations. Spending the last four years doing contract work for the Community Resource Council of Butler County. The main emphasis was to assist adult probation and parolees to find work and reintegrate into the community.

Greg was raised a Christian but like many others, turned away from his faith for a few years. In 1986, struggling with the responsibility of 2 children and a loving wife, he turned his life back to God and the Biblical teachings that put Love above self. Beginning an intense daily bible study, increasing his prayer life and listening to Jesus and the Holy Spirit, he improved his relationship with God. Little did Kelsey know that the next 24 hours after her tweet would change his Sad Papaw's life as the picture went viral and earned over 181,000 Retweets. A few days after, another of his grandkids made another tweet. This time, Brock Harmon decided to host a cookout for all the people touched by Sad Papaw's story. They invited everyone to try Sad Papaw's burger or buy the "I ate burger with Sad Papaw" t-shirt. At least 2,000 people turned up that Saturday, and the rest, as they say, is history.

Before becoming an Internet celebrity, Kenny Harmon was born and raised in Oklahoma. For most of his life, Kenny lived an ordinary life. Just like his forefathers, Kenny grew up in the American Kentucky lifestyle. The Harmons have a rich history upon which Kenny is very proud. McCalister, a widower and loving father who carries a bachelor's degree from the University of Central Missouri. McCalister worked for W.W. Grainger from 1984 to 2009 and enjoys collecting Japanese anime and manga, as well as playing golf.

McCalister shares, "This book is a culmination of many people's suggestions that I actually write a book about all of the miracles that I've seen during my life. Beginning with my own life and including what it was like growing up in the 1960s, the majestic temple I saw floating in the sky, the power and the glory I beheld while looking at the vision I saw while working for W.W. Grainger, and especially the two people I saw whom I knew had already passed away.

• What part of the book did you have the hardest time writing?

The most difficult part of writing it was remembering all the different miracles, when they happened, and how to put them in chapter form. I started writing in late 2019, and finally finished in mid 2021.

• What, to you, are the most important elements of good writing?

The most important elements to good writing are: 1) know your subject matter thoroughly, and 2) have a really good grasp of the English language.

 What comes first for you — the plot or the characters — and why?

If you're writing fiction, I think the characters should be first, then the plot. Why? Because it's hard to think up really strong dynamic characters. Then think of what kind of plot would work best for them.

• How do you use social media as an author?

I use Facebook and Instagram to message people about my miracles because I want the whole world to know that they are real, and to let them know the truth about the other side! I also write to celebrities and to those who have mentioned the passing of a loved-one, or if they speak about their church or about how God has helped them or changed their life.

• What's your favorite and least favorite part of publishing?

My favorite part of publishing is being able to actually hold a copy of my book in my hand and say "I did it!! I actually wrote a book!!" My least favorite part is not being able to see it on the shelves of bookstores!!

• How did you come up with the title for your book?

Well, I wanted the title to be about my miracles, but there were so many called "My Life of Miracles", so I wanted to change it a bit. The more I thought about it, I wanted to include something about myself, so I thought about how I was adopted, and pondered that anything bad could have happened to me! But, thank God nothing bad did happen!

Movie Treatment

Why Do You Need A Film Treatment?

Most screenwriters create film treatments for one of two purposes:

- Working out a complex idea: Writing a film treatment allows you to structure the story and find issues with the plot. It can also help with worldbuilding and developing compelling characters.

A script treatment comes earlier in the writing process, before any actual scriptwriting, which allows you to sort out the necessary story elements you need. The point of writing a film treatment is to:

- 1. Set up the world you want the reader to envision.
- 2. Lay out the structure of your whole story.
- 3. Help you identify plot holes, or parts of the film you're missing.
- 4. Flesh-out characters and figure out the importance of each role.
- 5. Serve as a road map that makes the journey of your film easier to navigate.

News Will the BookTok Bump Last?


July was the first month to date when sales from the roughly 180 BookTok authors tracked by BookScan fell from the prior year


dult fiction has been publishing's steadiestselling category for the past 18 months. Unit sales of print adult fiction books were up 8.5% in 2022 over 2021 at outlets that report to Circana BookScan, making it the only category to post an increase last year. In the first six months of 2023, adult fiction was once again the only category to register an increase, with sales up 4.2%. The biggest driver of those gains, of course, has been books that have the backing of BookTok.

But a new analysis by BookScan shows that BookTok's effect on sales is diminishing. The most notable sign of that softening came in July, when, for the first time, sales from the roughly 180 BookTok authors BookScan follows fell compared to the prior year. The 4.5% July sales dip means that year-to-date sales, which had been up by as much as 38% through May, were up 23% through July. (Total adult fiction unit sales have fallen every week since late June and are now up only 1.4% through August 12.)

BookScan analyst Kristen McLean estimates that monthly BookTok author sales comps for the rest of 2023 will be at or below 2022 levels, and that final sales will be close to the 2022 totals, when the BookTok authors tracked by Book-Scan sold about 47 million copies. In 2020, the first year BookScan tracked BookTok authors, sales for the group totaled 13 million copies, which then skyrocketed in 2021 to 27 million copies.

BookScan also took a look at how BookTok author sales were faring by examining trends within a July 2021 to July 2023 window. In that comparison, sales of adult authors,

after increasing 9% between July 2021 and July 2022, were flat in July 2023 compared to July 2022, while sales of young adult authors were down 1% in July 2023 after increasing 4% between July 2021 and 2022.

McLean explained that BookTok author sales couldn't continue to increase at the rate they had when the platform started to become a major discovery engine in 2020. She noted that books by BookTok authors are facing some of the same headwinds that the industry in general is, including consumers reading less in the period since Covid restrictions were lifted.

Even if BookTok sales are softening, McLean said, it remains the industry's most important platform for discovering new writers. "BookTok is really, really important for book discovery," she emphasized, noting that in today's social media-driven world BookTok is especially important as a place to find books for younger readers. There is one caveat, however: McLean said not as many new authors are making the type of splash that new authors did in 2021 and 2022. The top 10 Book Tok authors continued to sell in big enough numbers that their sales through July 2023 are equal or slightly above sales in the July 2021-July 2022 period. But sales of other BookTok authors, including newer authors, are not selling at the same pace, which suggests to McLean that the BookTok community "is becoming less efficient or engaged in surfacing new authors overall."

Nevertheless, new stars are still being made. Among this year's breakouts are Rebecca Yarros, whose *Fourth Wing* has sold almost 400,000 copies since its release in May, and Carley Fortune, whose *Meet Me at the Lake* has sold more than 230,000 copies since it was published in May. —Jim Milliot

The Weekly Scorecard

Print Sales Fell 7.6% in Early August

Unit sales of print books dropped 7.6% compared in the week ended Aug. 12, 2023, from the comparable week in 2022, at outlets that report to Circana BookScan. Once again, sales were down across all categories, including the once-sturdy adult fiction category, where sales fell 9.6%. The reason for the decline in adult fiction is not hard to find: the lack of titles that can match the sales velocity that books by Colleen Hoover and other BookTok-fueled authors achieved last year. A year ago, Hoover had seven titles among the top 10 on the adult fiction list that sold a total of more than 330,000 copies, led by It Ends with Us, which sold nearly 90,000 copies. In the most recent week, Fourth Wing by Rebecca Yarros stayed at #1, selling more than 40,000 copies. The three Hoover titles that made the top 10 list sold a total of about 61,000 copies. The strongest debut was Danielle Steel's Happiness, which sold almost 21,000 copies, putting it in fourth place on the category list. The adult nonfiction category had the best performance, but sales still fell 5.9%. Atomic Habits by James Clear returned to the category's top spot, selling nearly 21,000 copies. American Playbook by Clay Travis had the best debut, selling almost 16,000 copies-good enough for third place on the category list. The bestselling new release across all four children's categories was Disney Growing Up Stories, a juvenile fiction sound book set published by Pi Kids, which sold about 6,500 copies. Unit sales in juvenile fiction fell 7.6%.



• If you're planning a sequel, can you share a tiny bit about your plans for it?





• What was the hardest/easiest in the writing process? The research, character development and brainstorming were by far the most fun and interesting


